## Casa Pierina

More than 2,000 Swiss francs (£1,000) were raised for the Casa Pierina Museum Fund at the Diviani and Brentini Reunion held in Campello on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> August. Since then further donations and fund raising have brought the total to about £1,800 (Sfr.3'800).

The first step in the Casa Pierina restoration will be the removal of the old roof of "piode" (flat stones that used to cover most roofs in the local mountain villages), which is now leaking and in a very bad state. A new roof will then be put on, hopefully before the end of 2003 or at the beginning of 2004 to stop the building from further deterioration. The choice of the covering material will depend on the decision of experts who have been asked for advice and estimates of costs. The community (assemblea comunale) have already voted a credit towards this first step. It is estimated that about Sfr. 500,000 (£238,000) will be required for the complete restoration of this beautiful early 18<sup>th</sup> century house, which will include the museum, an exhibition room and an apartment to be rented. The Commune of Campello will have to

provide the money, helped by private subsidies and grants, which have been asked for as well as local, cantonal and federal agencies. Obviously, the money raised at the Reunion and any donations connected with it, is put into a Museum Fund and will be used solely for the equipping and maintenance of the proposed Museum, conservation of documents, for exhibitions to reflect Campello's past and to protect our heritage for the future.
